ReadyCitySM Response Exercise

Now that you have completed your ReadyCitySM Response Checklist and your Response Strategy to form your ReadyCitySM Response Plan, you will want to test it and modify it as needed. You will find three scenarios below. The first two have local consequences, and the third is considered a major national disaster which would affect your ReadyCitySM locally as well as nationally. In each instance, think through how you would network, prepare, and respond biblically. Consider how you would connect with your national Christian Emergency Network or other ReadyCitySM leaders to assist you. Consider the ReadyCitySM Response Checklist and Response Strategy to test your response plan. Once completed, review your response plan and adjust accordingly. It is helpful to take the greatest risk your community may face and ensure you have walked your ReadyCitySM leadership through each step to have a response plan in place that is likely at some point to be used. Most emergency managers welcome the opportunity to review your ReadyCitySM Response Plan. They will have much to contribute. In fact, if you know a Christian emergency manager, you may want them to assist in forming your ReadyCitySM Response Plan. They will be encouraged that you are taking this wise step before heading out with all good intentions but without a coordinated plan that is compatible with theirs.
